

## **Drying rack by Eve Wolfs**

Three identical stainless-steel grids, linked by four rings, form a minimalist and sustainable tripod that can hold up to 33 meters of laundry (6 kg). Designed for small urban spaces, it folds flat to just 3 cm with a single gesture, merging efficiency with elegance. Beyond its function, it stands as a sculptural presence in the room, whether in use or not. The first edition of 10 pieces was handmade in Belgium by artisan Lucien Van den Berge.

This drying rack belongs to Taboo, an ongoing collection rethinking the boundaries between what we hide and what we proudly display in our homes. From hygiene to funerals, Taboo objects invite us to see the everyday with new eyes.
